

## SOUTH COAST WATER DISTRICT CALIFORNIA-FRIENDLY PLANT REBATE PROGRAM

### Qualifying Plant Rebate List: Names & Descriptions

- Plant varieties may also qualify for rebates. Ask at a participating nursery.
- Plants are listed alphabetically by common name and are California natives, unless noted.

1.	<b>Alumroot or Island Alumroot</b> ( <i>Heuchera maxima</i> ): Perennial groundcover; round scalloped leaves; 2 to 3 ft clusters of pinkish white flowers on stalks; attracts hummingbirds.
2.	<b>Baby Blue-Eyes</b> ( <i>Nemophila hydrophyllaceae</i> ): Bell-shaped flower; 6 – 12 inches high; ferny leaf; abundant spring blossoms; colors range from sky blue to blackish purple with white rim.
3.	<b>Bush Anemone</b> ( <i>Carpenteria californica</i> ): Evergreen plant; 4 to 6 ft tall; clusters of scented white flowers with yellow centers in late spring/summer; dark green leaves.
4.	<b>California Buckwheat</b> ( <i>Erigonum fasciculatum 'Dana Point'</i> ): Originally, wild species growing on the Headlands; low groundcover; light green leaves; creamy white flowers; ice plant alternative.
5.	<b>California Fuchsia</b> ( <i>Epilobium californicum 'Catalina'</i> ): Perennial shrub; gray-green to green foliage; orange-red tubular flowers; attracts hummingbirds.
6.	<b>California Goldenrod</b> ( <i>Solidago californica</i> ): Low-spreading perennial; showy golden flowers.
7.	<b>California Iris or Douglas Iris</b> ( <i>Iris douglasiana</i> ): Low-growing, perennial evergreen; 3 inch wide flowers (white, lavender, purple flowers).
8.	<b>California Poppy</b> ( <i>Eschscholtzia californica</i> ): State flower; 2-3 inch diameter, golden-yellow to orange; large thickets of green foliage; Native Americans used for food, oil.
9.	<b>California Redbud or Western Redbud</b> ( <i>Cercis occidentalis</i> ): Small, deciduous, multi-trunk tree; 12 to 20 ft tall; clusters of magenta flowers on bare stems, early spring; round, bright green heart-shaped leaves emerge late spring, turn yellow before drop in fall.
10.	<b>California Sycamore or Western Sycamore</b> ( <i>Plantanus racemosa</i> ): Deciduous tree, arching branches; up to 40 ft tall and wide; light mottled bark; bright green leaves; fall color; wildlife habitat.
11.	<b>California Wild Grape</b> ( <i>Vitus californica 'Roger's Red'</i> ): Deciduous vine; red fall color; blue fruit.
12.	<b>California Wild Rose</b> ( <i>Rosa californica</i> ): Shrub, 3 to 9 feet tall and wide; erect stems, prickles; fragrant clusters of pink flowers; large orange-red fruit (hips), may be used for jam or tea.
13.	<b>California Wild Lilac</b> ( <i>Ceanothus</i> ): Groundcovers to small trees; deep green foliage; white, blue, purple flowers. Low: 'Centennial' or 'Heart's Desire' or 'Yankee Point' Medium: 'Concha' or 'Dark Star' or 'Joyce Coulter' or 'Skylark' Tall: C. arboreus or 'Ray Hartman' or 'Snow Flurry'
14.	<b>California Sunflower</b> ( <i>Encelia californica</i> ): Bright green evergreen shrub, 2 to 4 ft tall and wide; 2-inch wide, bright yellow daisy-like flowers, brown centers, long stems; spring and fall after rain.
15.	<b>Catalina Perfume</b> ( <i>Ribes viburnifolium</i> ). Low evergreen shrub; shiny dark green leaves; aromatic.
16.	<b>Catalina Cherry</b> ( <i>Prunus lyonii</i> ): Dense evergreen tree, up to 20 ft tall x 10 ft wide; large glossy-green leaves; cream flower clusters, late spring/mid-summer; large berries ripen green, red, black.
17.	<b>Chalk Dudleya</b> ( <i>Dudleya pulverulenta</i> ): Succulent rosette of broad pale-green leaves with chalky powder; cone-shaped red flowers on 2 to 3 ft stalks in spring; attracts butterflies, hummingbirds.
18.	<b>Coast Live Oak</b> ( <i>Quercus agrifolia</i> ): Large beautifully-shaped evergreen tree; oval leaves; grows 1-3 ft per year, some to 40 ft tall and wide in 15-20 years; heritage tree with nutritious acorns and habitat for various species, especially native birds; alternative to non-native tropical Ficus.
19.	<b>Coffeeberry</b> , California Coffeeberry ( <i>Rhamnus californica 'Eve Case'</i> ): Evergreen shrub mounding to 8 ft; dark green foliage; large berries ripen green to red to black; attract songbirds.
20.	<b>Coral Bells or Island Coral Bells</b> ( <i>Heuchera sanguinea</i> ): Compact evergreen; round leaves; long slender stems; delicate flowers spring to summer in white, pink, red.

21	<b>Coyote Mint</b> ( <i>Monardella villosa</i> ): Small perennial bush; rounded clusters of small bright lavender flowers; mint-scented foliage; Native Americans used for tea; stomach/respiratory/throat ailments.
22.	<b>Damianita Daisy</b> ( <i>Chrysactinia mexicana, non-native</i> ). Perennial evergreen shrub, 6 to 18 inches tall; bright yellow fragrant flowers and stamen in spring/summer.
23	<b>Deer Grass</b> ( <i>Muhlenbergia rigens</i> ): Cool season perennial bunchgrass, up to 3 ft tall and wide; olive green; slender white summer flowers grow to 5 ft; Native Americans ground seeds, wove stalks.
24.	<b>Foothill Penstemon</b> ( <i>Penstemon heterophyllus 'Margarita'</i> ). Flowering perennial, 1 to 2 feet tall, 3 ft wide; showy blue-to-pink flowers late, spring/summer; attracts hummingbird, bees.
25	<b>Golden Yarrow</b> ( <i>Eriophyllum confertiflorum</i> ): Spreading perennial 2 ft tall and wide; grey foliage; orange-yellow flowers in spring, summer; attracts bees, butterflies.
26.	<b>Island Snapdragon or Bush Snapdragon</b> ( <i>Galvezia 'Firecracker'</i> ): Woody perennial; lime green foliage; bright red flowers; attracts birds.
27	<b>Lemonade Berry</b> ( <i>Rhus integrifolia</i> ): Evergreen shrub, 5 to 15 ft tall, up to 12 ft wide; thick dull-green leaves; white-to-pink flower clusters, spring; flat red berries, summer; used for lemonade.
28.	<b>Lilac Verbena</b> ( <i>Verbena lilacina, non-native</i> ) Colorful shrub; mounding growth, 3 ft tall x 4 ft wide; fragrant lavender flowers, spring/fall; attracts butterflies.
29	<b>Live-Forever</b> ( <i>Dudleya lanceolata</i> ): Pale green succulent; fleshy pointed leaves, variable shape/size from basal rosette to bunches; erect stems; up to 20 flowers per branch, bright yellow, pink, red.
30.	<b>Manzanita</b> ( <i>Arctostaphylos</i> ): Curving shrub; red bark; grey-green leaves; green, red berries; attracts songbirds. Low: 'John Dourley' or 'Point Reyes' or 'Pacific Mist' or 'Emerald Carpet' Medium: 'Sunset' or 'Howard McMinn' or 'Louis Edmunds' Tall: <i>A. refugioensis</i> or 'Byrd Hill' or 'Lester Rowntree'
31	<b>Matilija Poppy</b> ( <i>Romneya 'White Cloud'</i> ): Compact perennial, 5 to 8 ft tall; upright blue-green stems/foliage; 'Fried Egg' flower, papery white, 9-inches wide; bright gold stamens; attracts bees.
32.	<b>Mexican Lobelia Bush</b> ( <i>Lobelia laxiflora, non-native</i> ): Mounding shrub with linear leaves; bright red and orange tubular flowers; attracts hummingbirds.
33	<b>Mexican Marigold or Mountain Marigold</b> ( <i>Tagetes lemmonii, non-native</i> ): Medium wooden perennial; mounding, dark green foliage; bright yellow-orange flowers.
34.	<b>Monkey Flower or Sticky (Bush) Monkey Flower</b> ( <i>Mimulus aurantiacus</i> ): Shrub; 3 ft tall and wide; buff-coral to deep orange flowers; spring, summer, possibly fall.
35	<b>Sagebrush or California Sagebrush</b> ( <i>Artemisia californica 'Canyon Gray'</i> ): Low round shrub 5 to 8 ft tall; small feather-like leaves, light green to gray; flowers yellowish, sometimes red; small fruit; aromatic; important gnatcatcher habitat.
36.	<b>Sage</b> ( <i>Salvia</i> ): <b>California Meadow</b> , Rich green grass-like groundcover. <b>Cleveland</b> ( <i>S. clevelandii</i> ), Medium aromatic shrub, 5 ft tall, 4 ft wide; grey-green leaves; 1-inch whorls of long lavender aromatic flowers; attracts butterflies, hummingbirds. <b>Hummingbird</b> ( <i>S. spathacea</i> ), Groundcover 1 to 2 ft tall; red, aromatic trumpet-shaped flowers on 1 to 3 ft stalks; attracts hummingbirds.
37	<b>Sage</b> ( <i>Salvia, non-natives</i> ): <i>S. chamaedryoides</i> (electric blue); <i>S. greggii</i> , or Autumn sage (red, coral, pink); <i>S. muelleri</i> (royal purple)
38.	<b>Seaside Daisy or Beach Fleabane</b> ( <i>Erigeron glaucus</i> ): Daisy-like flowers in white, pink, lavender or violet with yellow stamen; blue-green foliage and stems; clumps about 1 ft high and wide.
39	<b>Silver Carpet</b> ( <i>Dymondia margaretae</i> ): Compact, very tight to ground; blue-grey leaf on top, silvery sheen under; tiny yellow daisy-like flowers in summer.
40.	<b>Spectacular Mahonia or Hybrid Oregon Grape</b> ( <i>Mahonia 'Golden Abundance'</i> ): Large evergreen shrub, shiny leaves, 6 ft tall, 8 ft wide; showy yellow flowers, purple berries; attracts songbirds.
41	<b>Sundrops</b> ( <i>Calylophus hartwegii</i> ): Low spreading perennial; green leaves; large yellow flowers.
42.	<b>Tree Mallow</b> ( <i>Lavatera bicolor</i> ): Evergreen shrub; 3 to 12 ft tall; maple-like leaves; light pink, rosy lavender or purplish pink flowers.
43	<b>Toyon or California Holly</b> ( <i>Heteromeles arbutifolia</i> ): Evergreen shrub to small tree; up to 12 ft tall,

	8 ft wide; cream white summer flowers; bright red berries; attracts songbirds.
<b>44.</b>	<b>Wooly Blue Curls</b> ( <i>Trichostema lanatum</i> ): Evergreen; 3 to 5 ft tall; blue flowers, long stalks.
